## App Overview

Datum Link is a professional application for live monitoring, reporting, and data export from Datum Electronics torque transducers.

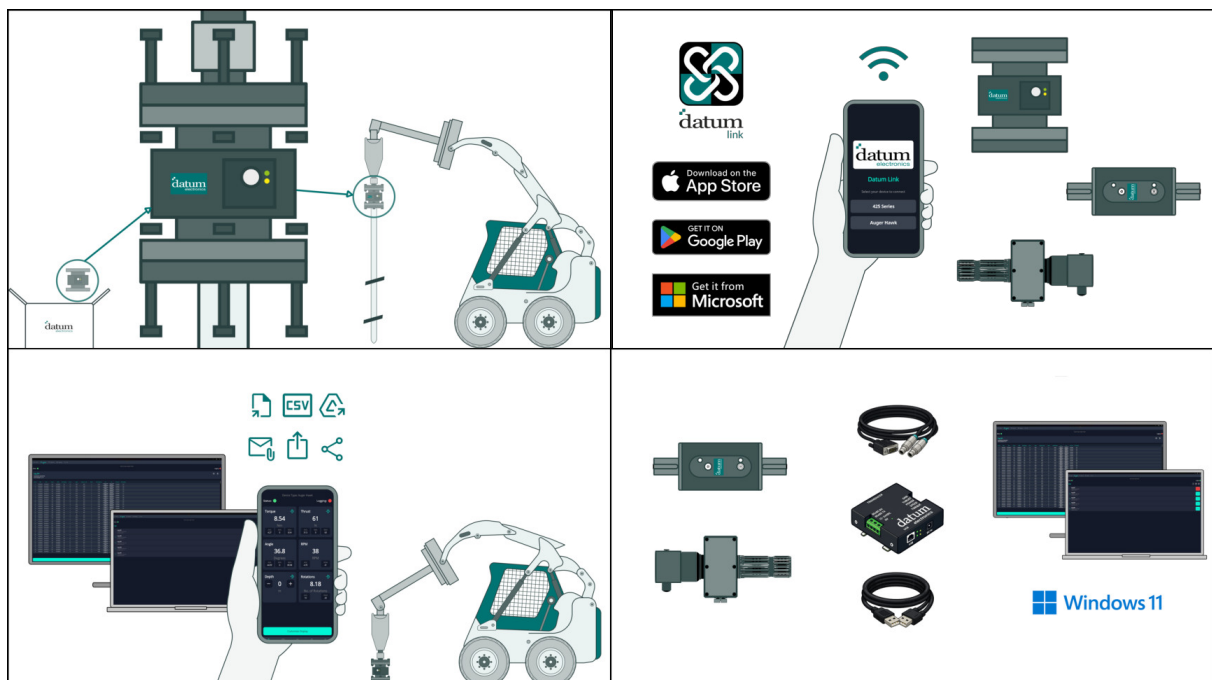
Datum Link supports two sensor families, the **425 Series**, and the **Auger Hawk Series**, which includes the RADIX 8000 PTM.

This app replaces the Datum Connect and Datum Auger Hawk apps, and combines the features of both into a single, unified platform.

Datum Link offers wireless connection over Wi-Fi, and Serial Connection via USB for 425 Series Sensors

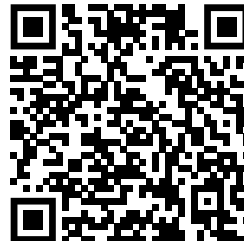
# About Datum Link

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## Download & Installation

Datum Link is free of charge and available for download from the App Store for iPhone and iPad, as well as on Google Play for Android Devices, and the Microsoft Store for Windows 11 PCs.



## Permissions

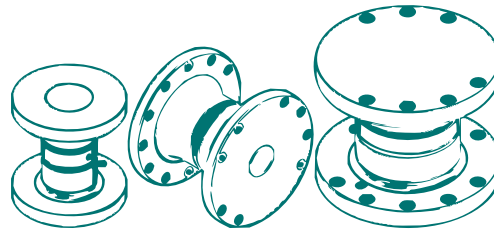
Datum Link requires the following permissions:

- **Location Services** – Optional for geolocation logging
- **Network Access** – Required for Wi-Fi device communication
- **Storage** – Required for log file management
- **USB-Serial** – Required for serial device communication (Windows only)

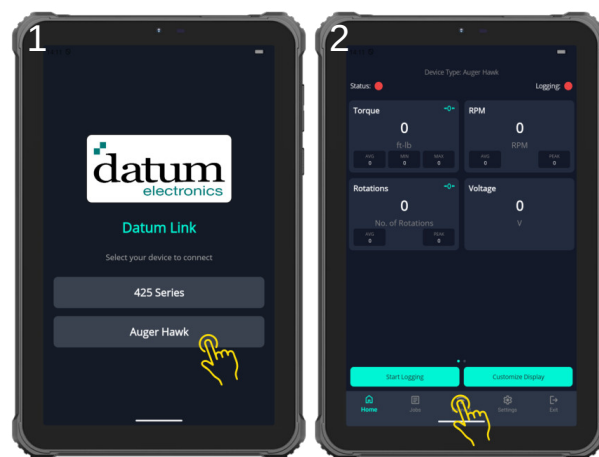


## Setup

Power on the Auger Hawk by pressing the button on the unit's transmitter.

Flashing green and amber LEDs indicate the unit is powered on.

**NB:** the amber LED displays as partially red when the device is not connected.



## Connection: Android

Open Datum Link and tap **Auger Hawk**<sup>1</sup>.

Tap Connect located in the bottom navbar<sup>2</sup> to display nearby Wi-Fi networks.

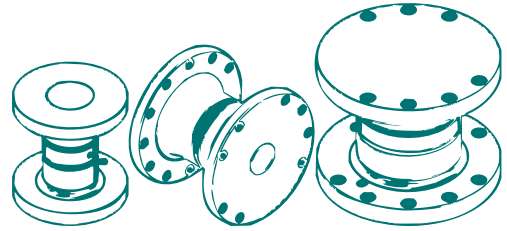
Tap Settings and select the SSID that reads **DATUM-** followed by a number<sup>3</sup>.

The top-left status icon will turn green to indicate a successful connection<sup>4</sup>. This may take up to two minutes.

**NB:** Android users may receive a notification asking them if they'd like to stay connected, tick **Don't ask again for this network** and then tap **Yes**<sup>5</sup>.

## Zero Offset

Due to their nature as sensitive precision sensors, a small reading (noise) may be detected even when no load is applied.

In the Home Tab, tap the Zero (→0←) icon<sup>1</sup> and select **OK**<sup>2</sup> to confirm the offset before starting measurements to ensure accurate torque values.



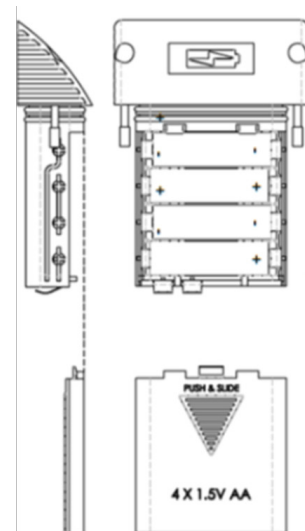
## Batteries

In the event that the Auger Hawk's transmitter is not powering on, consider replacing the batteries.

Unscrew and slide off the battery compartment's panel and replace with 4 x AA batteries. For best performance use 1.5V Lithium Ion Disulfides.

**NB:** the sensor does not turn off automatically, turn it off after use to preserve battery life.

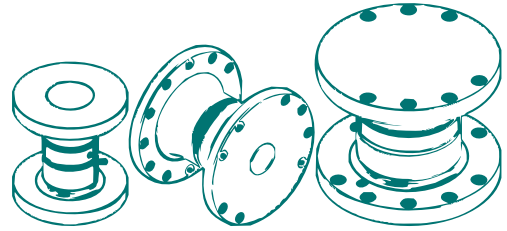

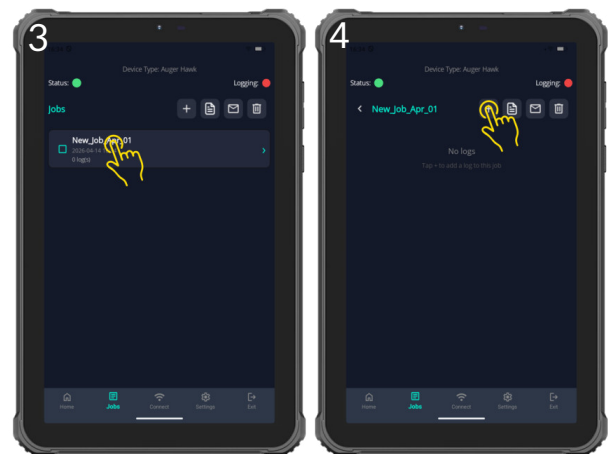
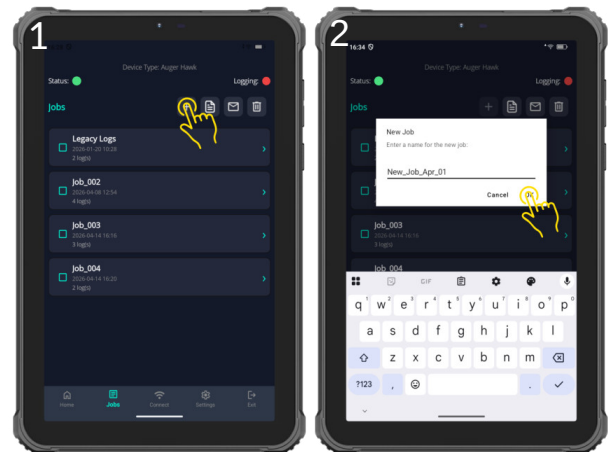


## Jobs and Logs

The Jobs Tab handles Log management, allowing users to create an individual or series of Logs, which can then be exported as Data Files, or used to generate PDF reports.

Logged data includes:

- Torque
- Thrust
- Angle
- RPM
- Rotations
- Voltage
- Depth (manual counter)
- GPS co-ordinates
- GPS accuracy (Metre radius)
- Date/Time

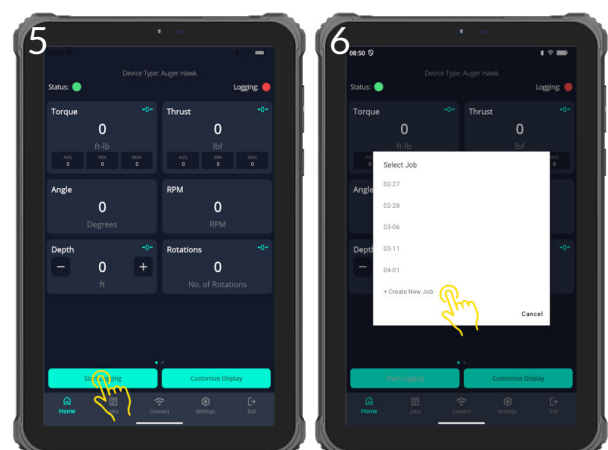

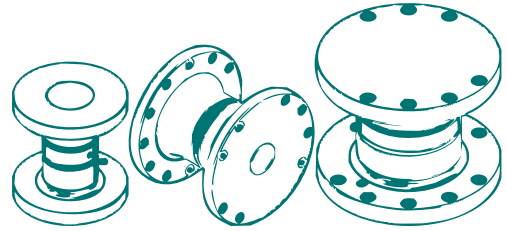
To create a Job, tap the plus icon (+)<sup>1</sup>, enter a name, and select **OK**<sup>2</sup>.

To create a Log, select the Job<sup>3</sup>, tap the plus icon<sup>4</sup>, enter a name, and select **OK**.

Jobs and Logs can also be created from the Home Tab by tapping the **Start Logging** button<sup>5</sup>. Any existing Jobs and Logs can also be selected in this way<sup>6</sup>.

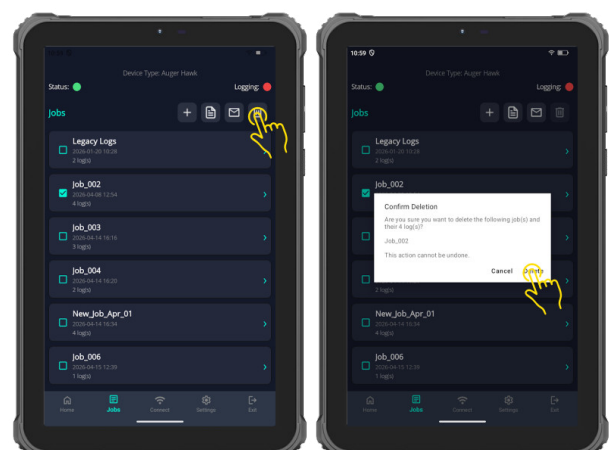
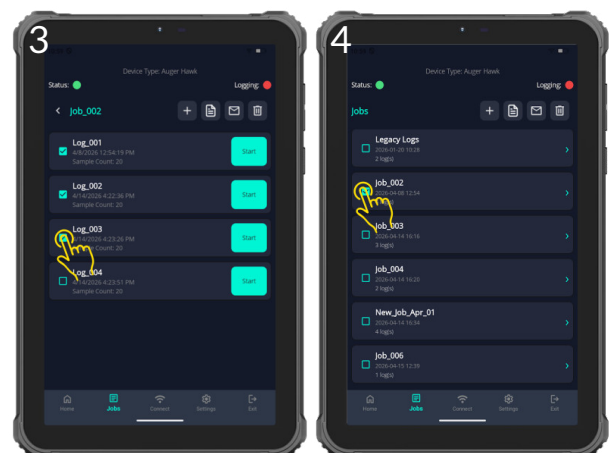
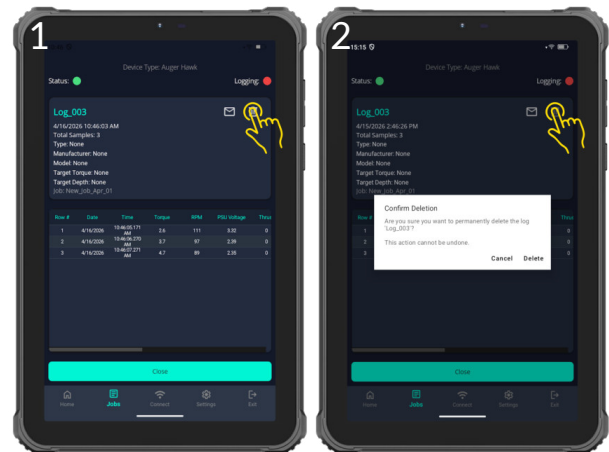
## Deleting Jobs and Logs

NB: Targets set in Log Metadata are for reporting purposes<sup>5</sup> only and do not affect alarm settings.

## Manual Depth Counting

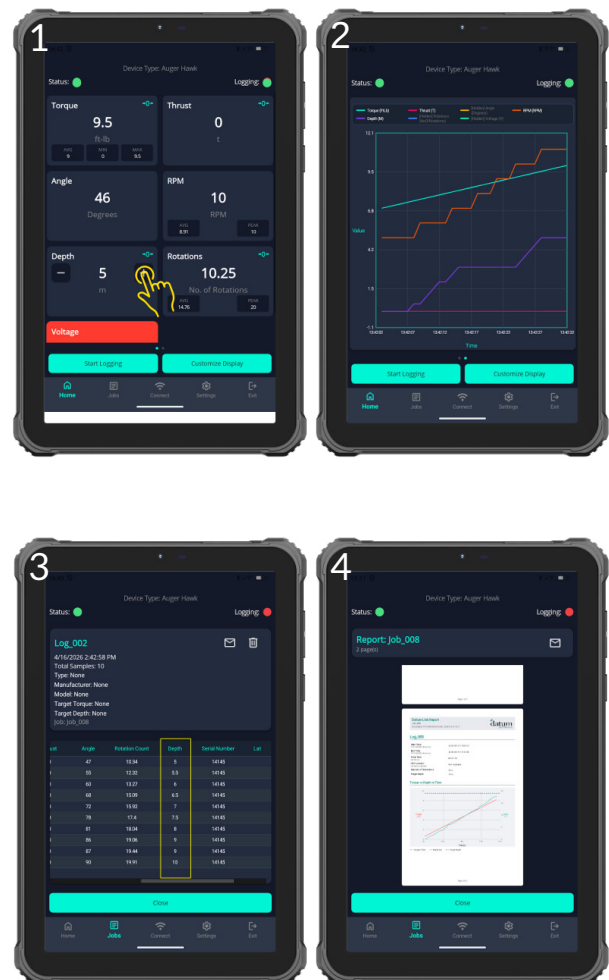
Datum Link allows you to manually add pile depth data to the active Log.

To add depth data, tap the plus icon (+) on the Home Tab<sup>1</sup>.

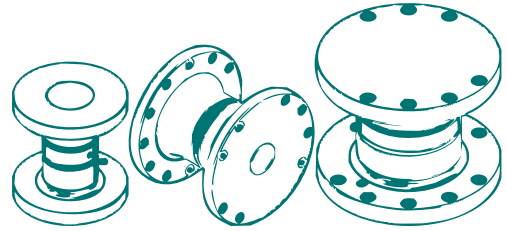
Depth is added in increments of 0.5 metres (500 cm) or 0.5 ft (6 inches) depending on the user settings.

The depth data can be viewed in Graph View<sup>2</sup>, in the Log itself<sup>3</sup>, and in exported Data Files.

Depth also features in generated Reports<sup>4</sup>, where it can be compared against the Target Depth added to the Log's metadata.

Ensure the Datum Connect Interface Unit (DCI) is connected to mains power using the DCI Power Supply Unit (PSU).

Connect the 425 Series Sensor to the DCI via the DCI Cable.

Green LEDs on the DCI and the sensor indicate they are powered on.

For more information on LED status please consult your sensor's User Manual.

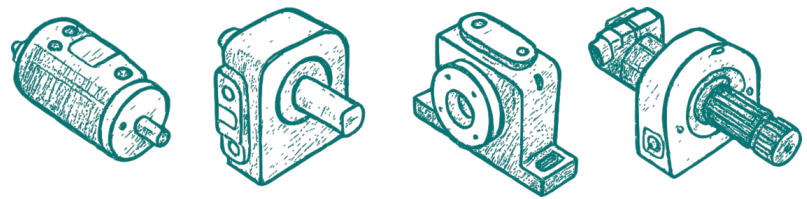
**Mode:** Datum Link supports two communication modes: Mode 1 (ASCII) and Mode 3 (Binary).

**Nominal Torque:** consult your product documentation for this value.

**Device Calibration (mV/V):** consult your product documentation for this value.

**NB:** in USB-Serial mode, settings are saved to the Windows PC. If switching between multiple PCs, ensure all share the same settings and zero offset.

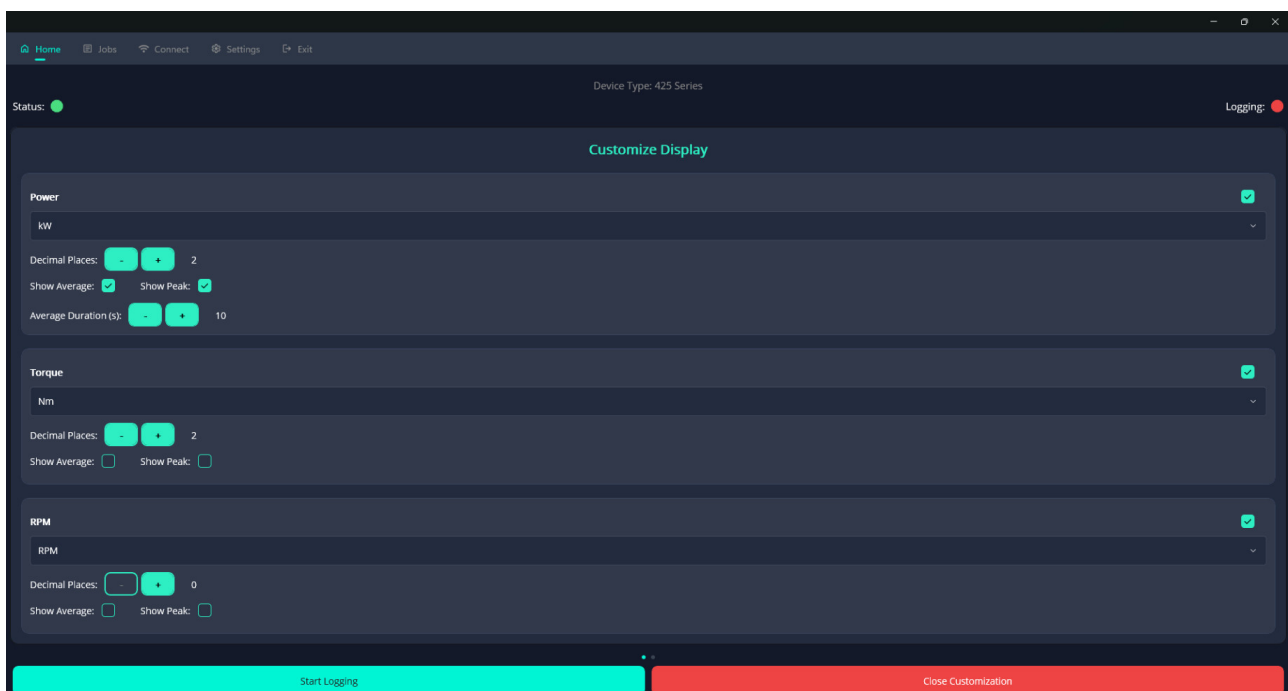
